### LOCAL VALUE

Smoky Hills PBS is a valuable asset to Central and Western Kansas, which is comprised of primarily rural communities. Many residents depend on broadcast television or streaming services because of their rural location.

In addition to programming, our services include the distribution of books to children, as well as schools and libraries across central and western Kansas. Smoky Hills PBS also hosts many educational and entertaining events throughout the year.

### 2019 Key Services

Smoky Hills PBS engaged with Kansas citizens in 61 counties through broadcast of local programming, Family Fun Day Events, our annual PBS KIDS Writers' Contest, local appearances through our participation in the 3i Expo Show and the Rural Opportunity Conference.

### Local Impact

With a broadcast signal that covers most of the Western half of Kansas, Smoky Hills PBS connects central and western Kansas residents with commercial free 24/7 kids channel otherwise unavailable.

We provide these services by leveraging partnerships with educators, community leaders, businesses, and volunteers.

Share A Story Program

Share A Story is a summer reading program where Smoky Hills PBS visits libraries across the viewing area. The event includes a video, story, and a craft project. The program helps to encourage parents to read with their children and use



hands-on activities to encourage reading. In fiscal year 2019, there were 73 Share A Story programs with 1,711 kids in attendance. Over 1,593 books were distributed during these Share A Story programs.

### **PBS Kids Writers Contest**



Smoky Hills PBS encouraged children throughout the viewing area to write and illustrate their own stories. Local winners were chosen in kindergarten through third grade. A total of 233 stories were submitted.

### **Book Distribution**

In fiscal year 2019, Smoky Hills PBS distributed 7,821 books to children in the viewing area, which included 46 counties througout our viewing area. These books were given to children directly, in partnership with the Kansas Head Start program and public preschools. Books are also given to teachers to use as part of their curriculum.

### The Importance of Smoky Hills PBS' Book Distribution

### FROM: Head Start Literacy Coordinator for Cloud, Republic, and Ottawa counties

The books from SHPTV through the Community Foundations is a very important part of our curriculum in all three counties. The books are often times a way that we can extend classroom learning into the home. As evident in the pictures, the books are read to the children in the classroom or in the case of EHS at the home visit. These teachers are trained Early Childhood professionals who have the skills to use a book to teach beyond the story. Also, we have a program in Head Start called Hubie the Hero. (a cartoon dog that helps promote extra learning at home) Teachers send daily slips home with the child that reflect what the family can do that evening to support the curriculum-such as "Practice counting to ten 3 times during the evening". Then the slips are signed and returned to be recorded for each individual child! So one night, the slip will say, "Read the new book from SHPTV as a bedtime story".

In response to the Dolly Parton Imagination Library: While getting more books into the home is wonderful, there is no way of knowing if those books are actually read to the child in the case of some of our EHS/HS parents. Some of our parents have lives that are chaotic enough that doing something simple
