Book Distribution



In fiscal year 2020, Smoky Hills PBS distributed 6,764 books to children throughout our viewing area, which included 46 counties. These books were given to children directly, in partnership with the Kansas Head

Start program and public preschools. Books are also given to teachers to use as part of their curriculum.

Learning Across Kansas

Working together with the Kansas Department of Education and Kansas Public Broadcasters, Smoky Hills PBS created the Elementary episodes of *Learning Across Kansas*. These episodes focused on providing supplemental education for students when the schools were forced to shut down due to Coronavirus. The episodes featured teachers from across our state. Each episode is 30 minutes. Featured in the elementary show is 2020 National Teacher of the Year, Tabatha Rosproy!



PBS Kids Writers Contest



Smoky Hills PBS encouraged children throughout the viewing area to write and illustrate their own stories. With COVID-19, our Writers Contest awards looked a little different. We were un-




