Smoky Hills PBS is a valuable asset to Central and Western Kansas, which is comprised of primarily rural communities. Many residents depend on broadcast television because of their rural location. For some. Smoky Hills PBS is the only channel they receive.

In addition to programming, our services include the distribution of books to children, as well as schools and libraries across Central and Western Kansas.

FY2023 Key Services

Smoky Hills PBS engaged with Kansas citizens in 71 counties through broadcast of local programming, more LIVE stream options, local sports coverage, Family Fun Day events, Share A Story programs, and our annual PBS KIDS Writers Contest.

With a broadcast signal that covers most of the Western half of Kansas, Smoky Hills PBS connects Central and Western Kansas residents with commercialfree broadcasting, a 24/7 kids channel, a CREATE channel. a LIVE TV button where viewers can watch our station LIVE any time, and a mobile app.


Local Programs that Matter Most to Our Viewers




First Book Club

In FY23, Smoky Hills PBS distributed **6,787 FREE books** to children throughout our viewing area. These books were given to children enrolled in public preschools and Head Start programs during their school day. This



is made possible because of our partnership with many foundations throughout our coverage area. The FREE books are also used by teachers as part of their curriculum.


- 1. **READ IT** Read a PBS KIDS book.


The PBS KIDS Writers Contest is an annual event that encourages children to write and illustrate their own


stories! In FY23, we received 92 stories from children across our viewing area! The top 3

begin school ready for the rigors of kindergarten are much more successful, more likely to perform on grade level and learn to read before reaching 3rd grade. Many children in Garden City do not have access to quality day cares and preschools that would help improve their kindergarten readiness. This is the reason that the PBS educational programming is so important in Garden City.

Alma's Way is one of the programs on PBS. Watching Alma's way helps children learn to empower themselves when dealing with a problem. It also offers children the opportunity to see children that look like them (mirrors), also to learn new perspectives from others (windows). Through Alma's Way children can learn to celebrate differences, practice empathy, and accept others living in our community.

Sesame Street, another PBS show for over 50 years, has served many families as an educational tool. Children who watch the show as a toddler gain an advantage in literacy and lan-

guage skills, math concepts, and have an increased vocabulary. PBS KIDS programing in Garden City is a perfect fit for our diverse families and many disadvantaged children as a way to help prepare them for kindergarten.


