# New PBS KIDS' Series Centers on Autistic Main Character

Animated series aims to nurture empathy and celebrate the varied ways that kids think.



*Carl the Collector*, a new animated series for children ages 4–8, is the first PBS KIDS® show featuring central characters on the autism spectrum. It premieres **Thursday, November 14**: streaming on pbskids.org, at 7:30 am all week on Nine PBS, and in English and Spanish at 10 am on PBS KIDS.

Through its stories, characters, and messages, and with a production team that includes neurodiverse writers, production staff, animators, advisors, and voice talent, the series celebrates the varied ways kids think and express themselves, while helping them develop a strong sense of self and community.

*Carl the Collector* follows the everyday adventures of Carl, a warm-hearted autistic raccoon who enjoys collecting things and loves his friends and family in Fuzzytown. Carl pays extraordinarily close attention to detail and comes up with unique ideas that others might not consider. These traits have helped him amass his extensive collections—from autographs and bottle caps to fake mustaches, pet rocks, sweaters, and virtually everything in between—which can come in handy for solving problems around the neighborhood with his friends.

Carl's friends include Sheldon, an empathetic beaver with a knack for connecting people and soft spot for the underdog. Carl's friend Lotta, a quiet and self-assured fox, is also autistic. She experiences hypersensitivity to loud sounds, powerful smells, and certain food textures,

and has exceptional talents in art and music. Other friends include Nico and Arugula, identical twin bunny sisters whose personalities couldn't be more different, and Forrest, a hyperactive and impulsive squirrel with a tree nut allergy, who is always down for an impromptu adventure.

"As an autistic writer, it's so exciting for one of my first TV writing gigs to be on a series that highlights part of my lived experience," says staff writer, Ava X. Rigelhaupt. "There's a saying, 'If you've met one autistic person, you've met just one autistic person,' which is something this show authentically demonstrates in every episode."

The new series was created by *New York Times* best-selling illustrator and author Zachariah OHora ("My Cousin Momo!").

The series' digital content for kids, families, and teachers, launching in tandem with the series, will reinforce its core messages of self-discovery and identity as well as recognizing and encouraging empathy for the many ways people think and behave.

Tammie Thomas is a special education teacher in East St. Louis School District 189 and has attended Edcamp since Nine PBS’s first gathering in 2018. She has taught for nearly 20 years. Before entering the classroom, she ran an early childhood education program from her home for nearly 10 years.

As a conversation partner, her wealth of experience is an asset to each attendee. Thomas views Edcamp as an invaluable experience to continue her lifelong journey of learning for the benefit of the children she cares for so deeply.

Also on a lifelong journey of learning is soon-to-be Dr. Anna Osborn. As a teacher and reading specialist for 23 years at Jefferson Middle School Esteem Academy in Columbia, MO, Osborn advocates for the importance of reading and literacy to advance life outcomes for all students.

She has integrated Nine PBS’s multimedia literacy initiative, *Drawn In*, into her annual curriculum, pulling from the comics and vocabulary resources to bolster the reading comprehension of her students. For three years, Osborn has also attended Edcamp, helping to deepen discussions and stretch the network of educators showcasing how the unique connections formed at Edcamp can challenge, strengthen, and support educators from a vast array of settings.

**Since 2018, Nine PBS has partnered with PBS KIDS® to offer Edcamp to our region’s educators with the support of Ready to Learn, a Corporation for Public Broadcasting grant. In 2023, 95 percent of participants agreed they gained actionable information to serve the children they work with daily. Throughout the three-part series, Worsley explores the parallel lives of Doyle and Holmes in the historical context of their times. From the dying years of Victorian England through the trauma of the First World War.

## Playing Like a Girl: The House That Rob Built

The true story of the underdog Lady Griz basketball team. In an era of gender discrimination in sports, the University of Montana Lady Griz bloomed under the fresh Title IX regulations that brought them equal funding, scholarships, and facilities. Their coach Rob Selvig drilled his charges with a philosophy new for its time: he expected the women to play just as hard as men.
