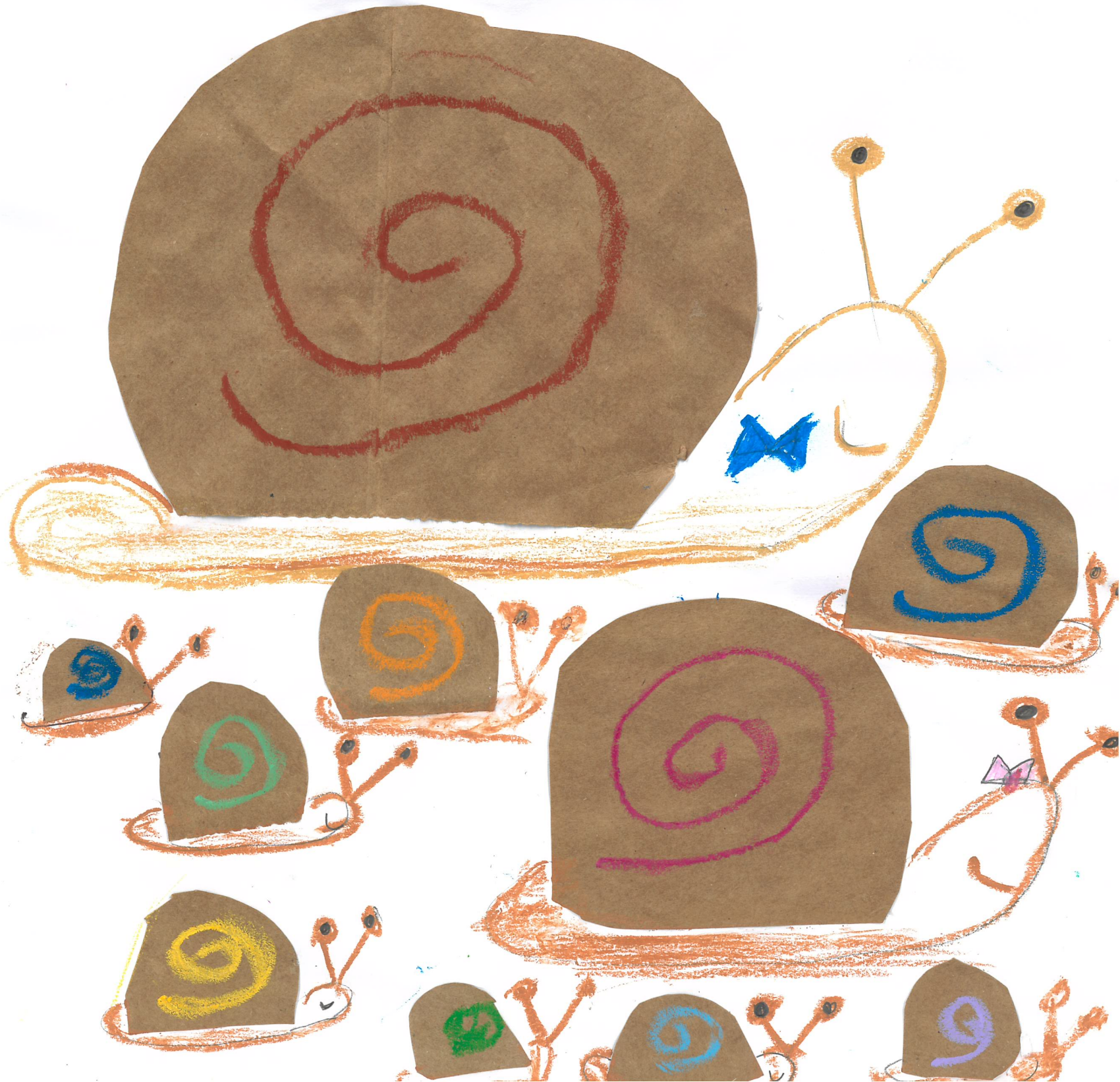


Looking on the **BRIGHT** side

the marvelous pains they kept.

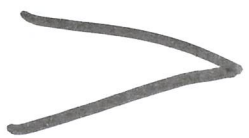
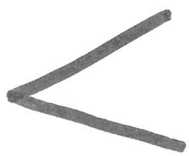
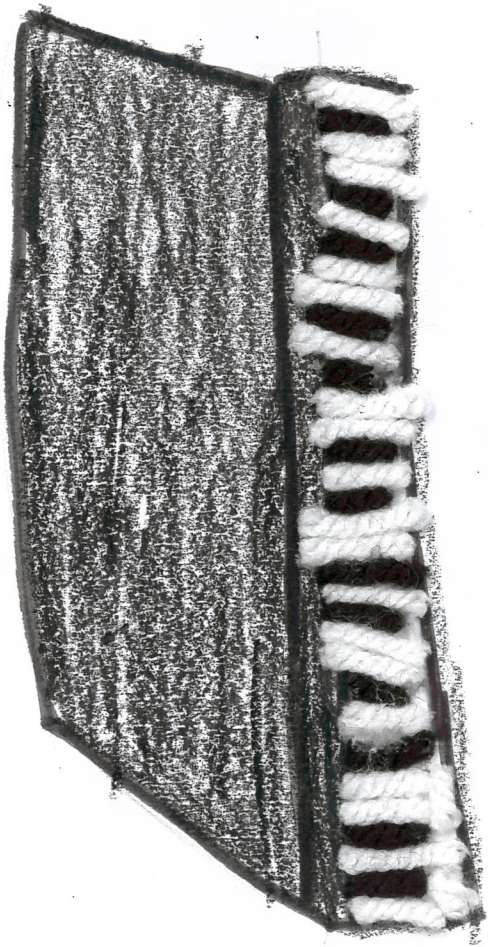
The next night, Smiley

because that will clear your hair,

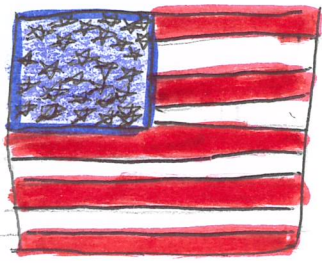


and you won't even need to wash it!

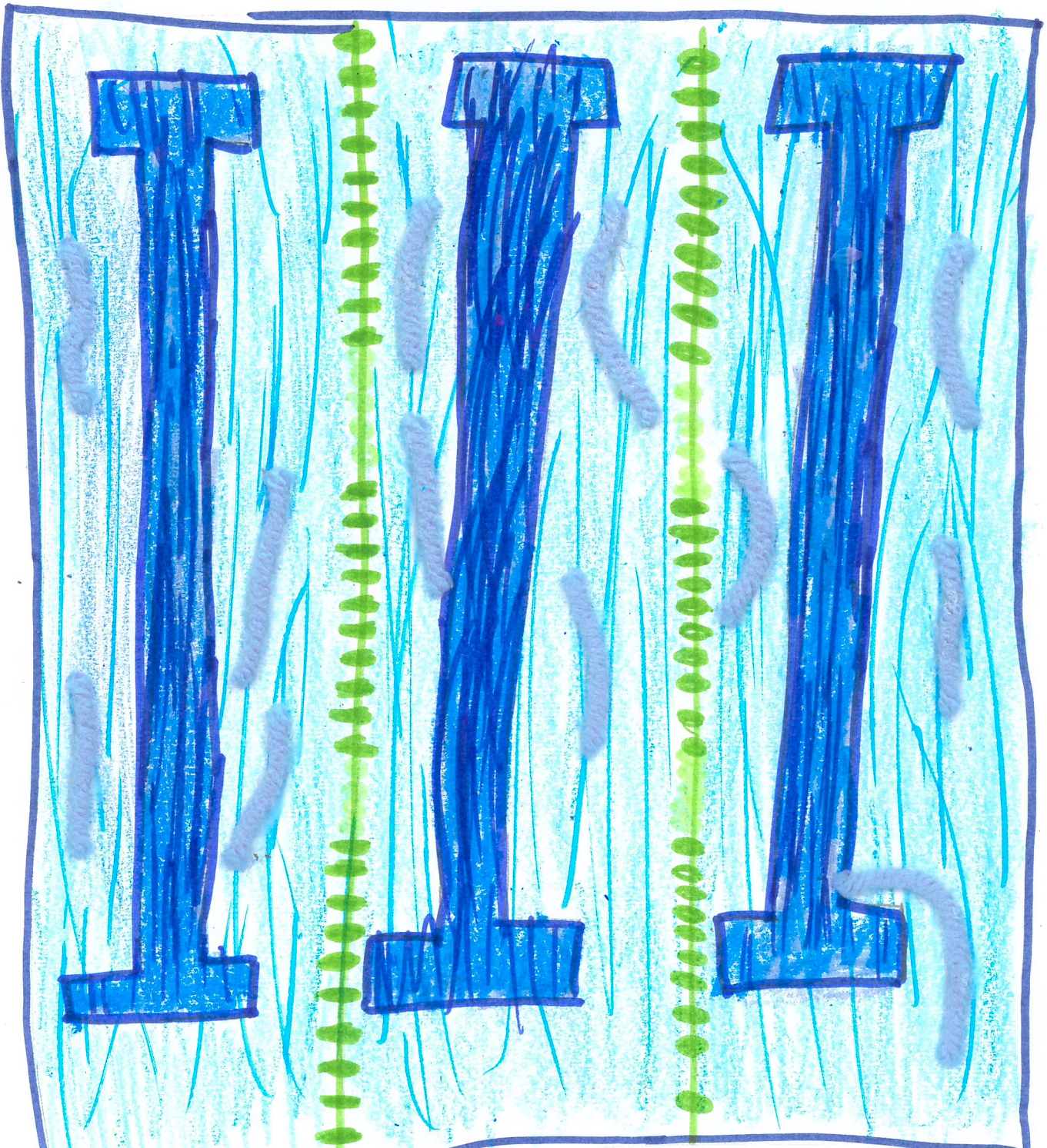
When you arrive at the pool, you are astonished by how big it is. When you look at the bottom of the pool, you think there might be sharks.
