## Stefanie Robey

Stefanie Robey is an award-winning producer who joined Maryland Public Television in 2013 to work on the statewide public TV network's original series *Maryland Farm & Harvest*. She currently produces content across genres on behalf MPT's Content Division.

Ms. Robey started her career at MPT in 2013 as an assistant producer helping bring about the premiere season of *Maryland Farm & Harvest*. She was promoted to segment producer for the series' second season, a role she maintained for five years. Ms. Robey produced upwards of 125 segments during her six seasons on the *Maryland Farm & Harvest* team, which took her everywhere from a ginseng farm in Appalachia to the oyster float operations of the Chesapeake to corn and soybean fields in every corner of the state.

In 2019, Ms. Robey transitioned from the *Maryland Farm & Harvest* team to take on her current position as producer. Her most recent projects include the half-hour documentaries *Braddock's Road: A Legacy Unearthed* (2022), which details the archaeological excavation of an 18th century military road, and *Discovering the Dove*, which follows the design and build of a replica 17th century sailing vessel, the new Maryland Dove. *Discovering the Dove* will debut in April 2023 during MPT's annual Chesapeake Bay Week®.

In 2020, Ms. Robey took over production of MPT's annual financial aid special *Ways to Pay for College*. Ms. Robey is also responsible for managing a range of projects across genres on behalf of the statewide public TV network's Content Division, including producing segments for MPT's long-running original series *Outdoors Maryland*.

Ms. Robey has earned five Emmy® Awards for her contributions to MPT series *Maryland Farm & Harvest* and *Outdoors Maryland*.

Beyond MPT, Ms. Robey has served in a freelance capacity as a food history writer for *Eaten Magazine*, podcast producer for *America's Test Kitchen*, and video editor for Lonely Planet TV.

Ms. Robey is a graduate of the University of Chicago, where she earned a bachelor's degree in anthropology.

Ms. Robey is an avid whitewater kayaker and hiker.
