He currently serves on the board of the Broadcasters Foundation of America headquartered in New York City.

On Maryland's Eastern Shore, Mr. Bodorff is past chairman of the boards of the Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum, the YMCA of the Chesapeake, and the Academy Art Museum.
