Ms. Respass leads her team in conducting statewide professional development sessions in early childhood education practices, particularly in the area of media and technology integration and curricula.

A regular presenter at local, state, and national early childhood education conferences, she currently serves on the Maryland Family Engagement Coalition and chairs its Early Childhood Technology Subcommittee. She is also past board of directors secretary for the Maryland Out of School Time Network.
