These Ambassadors represent professionals and advocates whose work aligns with engaging children ages birth to 8, as well as supporting early childhood educators, parents, and caregivers. This in-person training provided participants with the opportunity to connect directly with PBS NC staff, deepen their understanding of public media’s educational mission, and explore meaningful ways to engage families and communities across North Carolina. • Ongoing Network Training & Development: The statewide network of more than 100 Rootle Ambassadors continues to receive year-round professional development through a combination of virtual and regional learning opportunities. These offerings are designed to empower community-based early childhood champions and strengthen a collaborative community of practice across all North Carolina counties.

		As a trusted and deeply embedded program, the Rootle Ambassador initiative not only supports early learning ecosystems but also serves as a talent pipeline for PBS NC. Each group included approximately 18 students and 3 educators. These visits focused on media education and production, offering students the opportunity to shadow members of our production team, tour the PBS NC facility (including the Rootle suite), and participate in both formal and informal Q&A sessions. - High School Production Partnership: In December 2025, in collaboration with WHYY, we facilitated a hands-on studio experience for a group of high school students from Sanford, NC. During this visit, students shadowed the State Lines production team, rotating through three focus areas: audio, video, and control room operations. They engaged directly with production staff, as well as the show’s host and cast. Building on this experience and their classroom learning with instructor Tyreece Powell, students went on to produce four scripted segments for WHYY’s Good Neighbors Club, applying the skills they developed during their time at PBS NC. - Additional Career Representation: PBS NC continues to expose young learners to careers in media through participation in youth-centered productions such as Mini Fab Science Lab and Health Heroes. These opportunities allow students to see themselves in production roles and spark early interest in media careers. - Community Engagement: While traveling across the state with the Rootle Roadster Tour, we regularly engage with young people and community members curious about production work. These informal conversations often serve as meaningful touchpoints for career awareness and mentorship. For example, during a recent event at the Greensboro Science Center, we connected with a college student studying biology who expressed interest in science communication—highlighting the potential for future internship pathways such as SciNC. Additionally, participation in community events like the Boys & Girls Clubs art show allows PBS NC staff to model creative career pathways. By showing up as working professionals in the arts and media, we reinforce for young people that careers in creative fields remain viable and impactful.

13. Provision of assistance to unaffiliated non-profit entities in the maintenance of web sites that provide counseling on the process of searching for broadcast employment and/or other career development assistance pertinent to broadcasting;
14. Provision of training to management level personnel as to methods of ensuring equal employment opportunity and preventing discrimination;
15. Provision of training to personnel of unaffiliated non-profit organizations interested in broadcast employment opportunities that would enable them to better refer job candidates for broadcast positions;
16. Participation in other activities designed by the station reasonably calculated to further the goal of disseminating information as to employment opportunities in broadcasting to job candidates who might otherwise be unaware of such opportunities.
