








PBS member station, PBS Reno, serving northern








Have you ever wondered how chameleon got its color-changing skin?


Long ago, when Sabertoothed





Hummingbird was preparing her wings, zooming back and forth, showing off to the audience.


Finally, Monkey shouted,

"1, 2, 3." Chameleon heard.


He scattered up a tree and up on a leaf.




Meanwhile, Hummingbird was zooming to her favorite place, the flowers. "He'll never find me deep in the flowers."
