




In a quiet forest, there lived a little bunny named Benny.

"I'll climb that tree."




His friends, Sage the squirrel and Ivy the rabbit, didn't understand.

He wanted to see what was beyond the trees, beyond the hills.




"Someday," he told himself,


"I'll climb that tree."

the rough bark with his paws.




The climb was tricky.
