The mission of Blue Ridge PBS is to enrich people's lives by providing educational, informational, and cultural programming that fills a unique role as a positive and lifelong resource for the communities we serve.



Blue Ridge PBS, based in Roanoke, is a valuable part of southwestern Virginia's advancement, providing a variety of quality programming across multiple channels and platforms.

Blue Ridge PBS is comprised of five broadcast channels: WBRA-TV (15.1), Southwest Virginia PTV (15.2), Blue Ridge PBS Kids (15.3), Blue Ridge Create (15.4), and ECHO (15.5).

In addition, we have three online streaming channels: Blue Ridge Streaming, ECHO and Project Southwest.

In 2022, Blue Ridge PBS provided these vital local services:

- •Connections in the community through special events and projects
- Educational programming for learners of all ages with emphasis on locally produced content
- Locally produced content about a wide variety of topics along with a stellar selection of national content
- ECHO, a locally generated streaming to broadcast channel, dedicated to Education, Community, Health and Opportunity

Blue Ridge PBS' local services added more local content for and about the region on-air with Southwest Virginia PTV and ECHO as well as online with ECHO, Blue Ridge Streaming and Project Southwest. The Blue Ridge PBS Kid's channel continued to fill the need for children's programming around the clock. **Local and PBS** programming on our main channel.15.1. was continued throughout the region with support made possible by a partnership from local cable and dish providers.

Host, Bob Denton, is known as a political analyst for various news organizations throughout western Virginia.

On this new weekly show, Bob seeks to engage guests in conversation and dialogue about various issues and social concerns affecting Virginians. The goal of the show is to share and understand rather than oppose and debate.



THE LIFE OF A MUSICIAN

Danville, Virginia, serves as the backdrop for the series with each episode filmed in very unique locations, including historical homes, hotels, and even an old gas station.

Hosted by singer/songwriter/musician Brandon Lee Adams, each episode features fascinating conversations and music from well-known international artists.



REAL LIFE WITH SUSAN HARF

This series is hosted by Rose Martin and features Life Coach Susan Harf. As a trained personal and professional life coach, Susan offers solutions for everyday problems we all face in our relationships at home and at work.

Topics include: How to Diffuse an Argument, Keeping the Love Alive in Long Term Marriage, Friends – Why We need Them, and more.



Taylor Thyme

Local teen baker, Taylor Pusha, engages viewers with sweet recipes. A competitor in the national Kids Baking Championship and the creator of Taylor Made Cakes & Creations, she shares tasty treats and recipes made in her kitchen.

We wrapped up Season 5 of this popular series in spring with Season 6 going into production during the late summer. The program features a wide variety of writers who have connections to Virginia from first time writers to international best sellers. Recorded on location, each half hour interview delves into the stories behind the stories. We also record bonus interviews with each guest which are made available online.



BU\$INESS MATTER\$

The program, hosted by award-winning radio and print journalist Gene Marrano, explored business from a variety of viewpoints and scenarios - the big players, the up-and-coming, the look ahead; featuring interviews with the people helping to grow jobs, the economy, and the Blue Ridge region.



INTERSTITIALS

Information and entertainment went beyond the standard television format with short stories and segments that ran in our station breaks. A sampling includes:

- **Creative Virginia** profiles the artistic and imaginative people of Central and Southwest Virginia.
- **Eye on the Past** highlights the history and heritage of the people, places, and events in the region.
- On the Road Again visits interesting attractions and destinations that are just a short drive away.

ECHO: Looking to the Future, Reflecting the Past

2022 was a year of big anniversaries! ECHO celebrated its first birthday and Blue Ridge PBS celebrated it 55th anniversary of being on the air! Education and technology are key touchstones for both.

When Blue Ridge PBS (WBRA) was built in 1967, it was designed as the first all-color educational television station in the country.





In those early years, programs were presented live over-the-air by studio teachers covering everything from geography to advanced math. The technology and presentation style of education content has changed a great deal over the over the decades. ECHO reflects the original reason Blue Ridge PBS was founded – education. And just as the original station was on the cutting edge of technology, so is ECHO.

Combining streaming with traditional television, ECHO is designed to meet the needs of learners in all stages of life. It is the first station in the country to develop this advancement in local public media education. The goal is to provide accessible, educational programming

that is both informative and entertaining by "being where

others aren't."

Education, Community, Health, and Opportunity are the pillars that build the foundation for educational, communityoriented content. From early learners to those still learning from their life experiences, ECHO seeks to provide educational content that encourages everyone to learn something new every day.

A Sampling of Content Produced by Blue Ridge PBS ECHO

Cardinal News Updates— Cardinal News is a Southwest and Southside Virginia based non-profit news organization whose goal is to fill in the gaps left by retreating legacy media organizations. ECHO partners with them to provide a twice monthly news update.





Get Schooled: Field Trips – Produced in partnership with Center in the Square, these segments take students on a virtual field trip with explorer, Payton Moledor. Adventures included learning about paleontology at Virginia's Explore Park and finding out if air is a fluid with a visit to the Roanoke Blacksburg Regional Airport. (BTW, surprise! Air IS a fluid. A fluid is any substance that flows and has motion.)

Hands on Physics – This is a series of demonstration videos designed in partnership with Virtual Virginia and the Physics Demonstration Lab at Virginia Tech. Aimed at Physics 1 students, they are designed to fill the gap that can sometimes exist in online courses when demonstrating key scientific principles due to lack of access to materials or facilities.

Hands on Health – This co-production with Virtual Virginia is a series of videos that demonstrate a variety of first aid skills from CPR to treating adult and infant choking and more.

Pip's Tips - Designed for primary or elementary school learning, this series follows Pippy Pinewood (aka Pip) as she shares tips for her young Dewdrops. The SOL correlated tips cover a wide variety of topics with a dash of fun added! Pip even learns a few things herself on the way.





Field Notes/Hoot & Holler – Field Notes is an occasional live performance series. Included is Hoot and Holler. Recorded at Roanoke's historic Grandin Theatre, Hoot and Holler is story telling at its best with each performance built around a theme.

Day of Remembrance – March 19, 2022, marked the second anniversary of the first case of confirmed COVID 19 in the Roanoke City and Alleghany Health District. A ceremony was held to mark the occasion and to thank first responders, volunteers, and others who have helped combat the spread of the virus. This event was closed to the public. Sights, Sounds and Stories of Southwest Virginia



Project Southwest continued to celebrate Virginia's heritage in 2022 with its 24/7 multi-platform "community first" streaming YouTube channel. It is available free to the public and designed to create and spread positive awareness about Southwest Virginia which is an often underserved, misunderstood, and misrepresented region of Virginia's Commonwealth.

For two years PSW producers have shared exciting and beautiful outdoor adventures, portraits of interesting people, and toe tapping music like the series, *Musical Portraits* which showcases phenomenal local musicians in stunning local locations.

PSW partners include the Virginia Tobacco Region Revitalization Commission, Mountain Heritage Museum & Gallery, and more.

PROJECT SOUTHWEST

But MORE is on the way for the western region of Virginia.



In 2022, Blue Ridge PBS began laying the groundwork for a new PBS affiliate to serve the area. We are creating a first-of-its-kind, all-digital television station. Rather than using the traditional broadcast antenna, distribution will be a linear stream that can be seen online, local cable channels, and through an app.

Dedicated to serving Southwest Virginia, PBS Appalachia (PBSA) will serve 13 counties in one of the only areas of the country not currently served by a PBS station. Along with local content, the station will deliver the full PBS schedule including PBS Kids, PBS NewsHour, Masterpiece, Nature, and NOVA.

The award-winning PBSA team will tell the stories of our communities, celebrate our heritage, highlight our people, and look forward to our region's growth; all through the lens of industry-leading equipment and the eye of award-winning producers. Our first two signature series are *French Magnolia Cooks* and *Hometowns*.

French Magnolia Cooks is an inspirational, savory and educational epicurean journey through Southwest Virginia. Chef Missy takes viewers from hunt & farm to chef & wine to the table. Field and Stream with John Gurley. Wine with Thomas Fraley. Recipes with warmth & humor by Chef Missy.



Hometowns – Originally a part of Project Southwest, this multi-award-winning series profiles the Appalachian communities our viewers call home.

With support from the Commonwealth of Virginia and the Virginia Tobacco Region Revitalization Commission, PBS Appalachia Virginia is on track to launch in June 2023.
