<b>Local Utilities and infrastructure</b>	Newsmakers	4/4/24 and 4/7/24	7:00pm and 12:30pm	30 minutes	This episode featured the new executive director of the Evansville Sewer and Water Service, Vic Kelson. Kelson discussed the upgrades being made to the utility service, rate increases, and the new cascade waterfall park.
<b>Local Road Closures and Improvements</b>	Newsmakers	4/11/24 and 4/14/24	7:00pm and 12:30pm	30 minutes	This episode featured Nicole Minton Public Outreach Manager of the Lochmueller Group discussing the upcoming closures and improvements to the West and East sides of the Lloyd Expressway and how commuters will be impacted. It also featured Gary Brian, Public Relations Director of SWINDOT discussing other surrounding road closures and improvements.
<b>International Conflict</b>	Newsmakers	5/9/24 and 5/12/24	7:00pm and 12:30pm	30 minutes	This episode featured Dr. Daniel Byrne, Professor of History at the University of Evansville as he explained the Israeli/Hamas conflict including their history and the impact it has on us locally.
<b>Community Revitalization</b>	Newsmakers	5/30/24 and 6/1/24	7:00pm and 12:30pm	30 minutes	This episode featured Josh Armstrong and Lloyd Winnecke from the Evansville Regional Economic Partnership as they discussed the finalized plans for revitalizing the riverfronts in Newburgh, Evansville, and Mt. Vernon.
<b>Local Election</b>	Shively and Shoulders	4/25/24 and 4/28/24	7:30pm and 10:30am	30 minutes	In this episode, hosts Judge Les Shively and Attorney Pat Shoulders discussed the recent primary election results with Dr. Robert Dion from the University of Evansville, and Dr. Matt Hanka from the University of Southern Indiana.
<b>Local History</b>	Historic Churches of Evansville	6/13/24	8:00pm	60 minutes	This locally-produced documentary explored the many older church buildings in Evansville with a look at their architecture and history in the community.
<b>Women</b>	Local Women With Inspiring Stories	6/27/24	8:00pm	60 minutes	This locally-produced documentary featured eight local women and their stories of overcoming obstacles to reach their goals professionally and with family. Stories of hardship and discrimination served as a catalyst of each woman to succeed.
<b>LGBTQ History</b>	Out and About in Evansville	6/5/24 and 6/9/24	7:00pm and 4:30pm	120 minutes	This documentary focused on the history of the Evansville's LGBTQ community from the 1950's to present. Presented through interviews with local residents, viewers learned about the trials and tribulations the community faced.
<b>State Government</b>	Shively and Shoulders	6/20/24 and 6/23/24	7:30pm and 10:30am	30 minutes	This episode featured hosts Les Shively and Pat Shoulders talking with Indiana Governor Eric Holcomb about his past successes and his plans for leaving office at the end of the year.
<b>Rural Farms and Families</b>	Homegrown Heritage	6/20/24	8:00pm	60 minutes	This locally –produced and Telly award-wining special focused on generational farm families and meaning of “keeping the farm in the family”. Heartwarming and inspiration stories give the viewer an insight into the rural farm family.

In addition to the reported programs, WNIN regularly tapes and airs various speakers and presentations that have a local interest. During the 2nd quarter of 2024, WNIN provided the following content on 9-1: Evansville Rotary Speakers State Rep.
