Governor Albert Bryan's 5th State of the Territory Address

Governor Albert Bryan, Jr. delivered his fifth State of the Territory Address. WTJX provided live coverage of the Governor's address with a panel from WTJX's St. Croix office. The panel consisted of Lesley Comissiong, Almando "Rocky" Liburd, Usie Richards, Denis Lynch II, and Roosevelt David. During the address, the Governor highlighted his administration's successes and provided an update on the Virgin Islands Water and Power Authority, education, crime, plans to raise wages, plans to solve the housing crisis, finish long-overdue capital projects, and billions in federal relief funding to improve all Virgin Islanders' lives. After the address we received reaction from the Delegate to Congress, Senators, and the public. We aired this program on WTJX-FM as well.

Virgin Islands Case Files

We wrapped 10 episodes of Virgin Islands Case Files hosted by Celia Carroll. Virgin Islands Case Files was a monthly half-hour show that explored local unsolved murder cases. The show was created to bring renewed public attention to these cases in an engaging and non-exploitative way.





Recovery in Focus

The Virgin Islands continues its recovery efforts after the passing of hurricanes Irma and Maria in 2017, and WTJX continues season three of Recovery in Focus, providing viewers with a first-hand look at the most recent developments as well as other critical projects that impact the daily lives of residents. This program is hosted by Adrienne L. Williams-Octalien, the Director of the Office of Disaster Recovery. Her guests appear and speak about the latest projects and updates their respective agencies are currently leading to aid the territory's recovery from the 2017 storms, their successes, and their setbacks.

The Bookcase

The Bookcase premiered its third season in 2023. In this season, which consists of 20 episodes, the show explored local tales that have been passed down through generations, such as, *How Anansi Spun Madras* and *Rica and the Tamarind Tree*, and discuss empowering narratives, such as *Because they Dared*. For the history buffs, we examined historic pieces, such as *Quadrille*. The diversity in this season gave viewers the opportunity to experience different types of writing styles and literary techniques. Each episode featured a glimpse at each author's writing process, the inspiration behind writing their work, and their favorite passages.

WTJX made a presentation to the Department of Human Services (DHS) Office of Child Care & Regulatory Services on PBS Learning Media and the PBS Kids website. The purpose was to give information on various tools and resources WTJX could extend to the Headstart centers. WTJX also presented at the AFT TEACH Workshops on St. Croix and St. Thomas.

WTJX supported the Gentlemen of Jones first annual Golf Tournament this past April. The Gentlemen of Jones is a Crucian organization established 70 years ago. This tournament was hosted to get the community's support in assisting the Gentlemen of Jones with their efforts to beautify Christiansted during the holiday and festival season. WTJX entered two teams in the golf tournament, one representing WTJX-TV and the other representing WTJX-FM. The System's members and friends stepped up to represent the stations in the tournament.

WTJX sponsored a Meet and Greet for Hampton University Alumni and President on St. Thomas on November 16. Many Virgin Islanders attended Hampton University which recruited heavily in the territory. Hampton University played in the Paradise Jam tournament which was carried on ESPN. There was a great turnout as alumni greeted the Ret. U.S. Army General, Hampton President Darrell K. Williams on his first trip to the Virgin Islands.

Comes with the Territory

WTJX-TV launched its exciting new program, Comes with the Territory. This hour-long Sunday news/information show, anchored by seasoned political analyst, Lesley Comissiong, is a muchanticipated addition to our programming lineup. The show's first segment opens with engaging interviews featuring prominent local figures and newsmakers. Following the interviews, Comes with the Territory, delves into a spirited panel discussion, providing a comprehensive examination of the most pressing political matters affecting the U.S. Virgin Islands.

What sets this show apart is its commitment to making the often-intricate world of politics accessible to all viewers. In a landscape where political discourse can be overwhelming, Comes with the Territory takes a refreshingly factual and multi-perspective approach. It is dedicated to simplifying complex political topics, ensuring that our audience gains a thorough understanding of the issues at hand. By presenting various viewpoints, the program encourages critical thinking and informed civic engagement among our viewers, fostering a more enlightened and engaged community. "Over the years, I have gained the trust and confidence of the community to be a voice that they can rely on for information that is valuable, straightforward, and easy to understand, with the flexibility to learn, grow, and educate the community, and people appreciate that," Comissiong said. "I hope to bring that trusted perspective back to the community."

WTJX-TV, Channel 12 transitions to HD on Dish Network

While WTJX Channel 12 has been available on Dish Network since 2019, it was in standard definition signal which was not the best quality. On February 22, 2023, upon request, Dish transitioned to our HD signal, giving WTJX viewers a sharper, clearer visual experience.





Reviving Little League Baseball

WTJX co-sponsored the First Annual Jerry Browne Little League Baseball Classic on St. Croix. The six-team tournament aims to improve baseball participation on St. Croix and to inspire young people to try baseball as an option. Little League in the Virgin Islands has suffered setbacks in progress due to issues with infrastructure and organization. WTJX sponsored the payment for the umpires so that the tournament could be successful. Jerry Brown, also known as the Governor, was born on St. Croix and played 10 seasons in the Major Leagues with the Texas Rangers, Cleveland Indians, Oakland A's, and the Florida Marlins.

Better Coverage on St. Croix

WTJX completed a construction permit that we applied for from the Federal Communications Commission. This construction increased the power output of our television translator on St. Croix from 300 watts to 3000 watts. As a result, the coverage and reception of WTJX on St. Croix has improved from 70% to over 90% for residents who depend on receiving the station with an antenna. The stronger signal penetrates buildings easier. For example, depending on where they reside, some residents would need an inside antenna as opposed to an outdoor antenna. This is a big win for viewers on St. Croix who have decided to cut the cord and want access to our 3 channels. Most of the island of St. Croix is outside of our transmitter signal so it is serviced by a television translator. This increase in power will provide more service to our unserved community.

Gold Medal Recognition and Parade

• History: The Virgin Islands Basketball Federation (VIBF) was founded in 1962 and in 1964 became a member of the International Basketball Federation (FIBA). The Basketball Federation is one of the six V.I. Sports Federations that were affiliated with their International Bodies and became one of the founding members of the Virgin Islands Olympic Committee (VIOC). In 1966 the VIOC was allowed on a trial basis to participate in the 10th Central American and Caribbean Games where the first Women National Team finished fourth after beating Puerto Rico in their first game of the competition. It wasn't until 2010 that the Women National Team returned to the 21st CAC Games in Mayaguez, Puerto Rico, again finishing in fourth place. The 23rd CAC Games in 2018 were held in Barranguilla, Columbia where the Women National Team finished in fifth place.

It's important to note that following the initial appearance of the Women National Team on a trial basis in 1966, FIBA disbanded the Caricom Basketball Confederation, a sporting arm made up of political and economic regional allies. In 1999 FIBA established the Caribbean Basketball Confederation (CBC), paving the way for a clear path for qualifiers for female basketball. This meant that Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands were now mandatory members of the CBC, and Belize was assigned to the Central America region. The Women National Team participated in their first CBC Championship in 2000 in Bridgetown, Barbados.

The Women National Team has medaled throughout the years since participating in the CBC Championships. In 2017 the V.I. Basketball Federation hosted the Women's Centro-Basket Championship on St. Thomas, where the Team captured the gold medal against the top seven teams in the Central American and Caribbean region.











In March of 2021, during FIBA's coronavirus protocols, the Women National Team captured the silver medal at the Centro-Basket Championship in San Salvador, El Salvador. Both the 2017 and 2021 medal finishes qualified the Team for their first and second appearance at the FIBA Americas Women Championship for the top 10 teams in the Americas. In November 2022, the Centro-Basket qualifier for the 2023 CAC Games were held in Chihuahua, Mexico, where the V.I. Senior Women National Team was unable to attend. The withdrawal of the Bahamas Women National Team from the 2023 CAC Games opened the door for the V.I. Women National Team to serve as a replacement team at these games. These young women went from being a replacement team to becoming the first ever team sport to capture a gold medal at the CAC Games and earning the 12th Gold Medal under the auspices of the VIOC at these games. The Team Delegation included players Kadasha Barry, Lanese Bough, Kaya Evans, J-Naya Ephraim, Shomyra Francis, Anisha George, Natalie Kleemann-Day, November Morton, Naja Ngongba, Keshara Romain and Imani Tate. The staff included Head Coach, Tajama Ngongba; Assistant Coach, Clint Williams; Team Manager, Rufus Horton; and Delegate, La Reina Robinson.

• History of Nicholas D'Amour: Archery is a young sport to the Virgin Islands. Nicholas D'Amour began exhibiting his competitive skills as an archer under the auspices of the Virgin Islands Archery Federation. In 2021, he was awarded the Recurve Junior Men Athlete of the Year award by the World Archery of the Americas. In the same year, Nicholas competed in Europe, winning the silver medal at the European Grand Prix. He also represented the Virgin Islands in the 2020 Olympics that was rescheduled to 2021 due to the corona virus pandemic.

During the 2022 competition schedule, he successfully competed and captured two gold medals and one silver medal. Nicholas won the 2022 gold medal at the 8th Copa Merengue, a gold medal at the 2022 U.S. Open, and a silver medal at the 2022 Indoor Vegas Shoot. In 2023, Nicholas won the bronze medal at the Indoor Archery World Series and won the gold medal at the 2023 Central American and Caribbean Games in San Salvador, El Salvador.

This achievement represents the 13th gold medal won at these games under auspices of the Virgin Islands Olympic Committee.

 The Recognition Ceremony & Reception: Most of the basketball team were not on island so it was a huge lift to coordinate getting everyone on the island of St. Croix where most of the members are from. And, although Nicolas was out of the territory competing at the time, his father traveled to participate in the celebration on his son's behalf. To honor these athletes, WTJX partnered with the VIBF, the Virgin Islands Olympic Committee, and Government House with a weekend celebration. On Friday, August 4, 2023, we held a Recognition Ceremony & Reception at Government House where the Governor, President of the Virgin Islands Olympic Committee, and WTJX's CEO presented gifts to the players, coaches, and supporting staff. The players were presented with checks of \$5,000 each. This sum was passed by the Legislature of the Virgin Islands. They also presented a Perma Plaque to the team co-captain at the ceremony. Governor Albert Bryan Jr. lauded the women for their athletic prowess and resilience. After, on the grounds of Government House, there was a reception with a live band.

This will undoubtedly motivate more athletes, especially females, to strive for greatness and know that they have their community's full support.

While the station's recovery from the 2017 hurricanes remains elusive, we have still managed to provide programs and services to the community. Our dedication to improving our signal to our St. Croix and Dish viewers are impactful. WTJX had not upgraded its TV translator on the island since the station's inception 51 years ago. We have also brought new local original programming to help our community understand the developments in the community.
